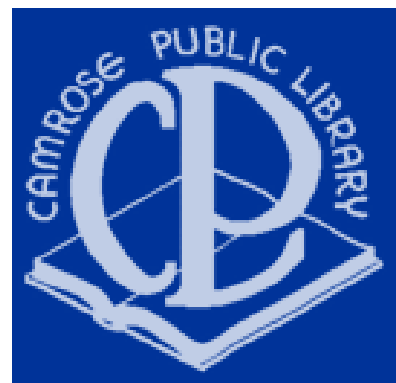
### Looking for something fun to add to an event for children?

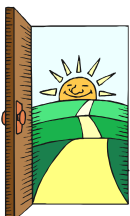

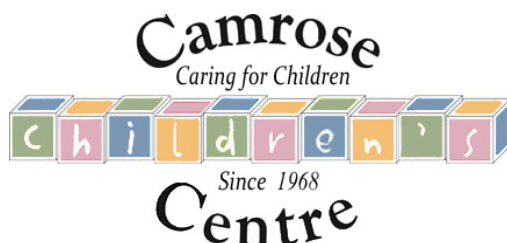

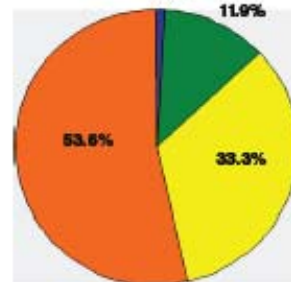
